million dollars of textile machinery imports were realized, while 1 billion 450 million dollars of the Turkish domestic market's capacity was met by domestic textile machinery manufacturers. In the same period, exports of Turkish textile machinery manufacturers recorded as 840 million dollars. Turkey is the world's largest machinery buyer, right after China and India. It is the most important market for both domestic and foreign machinery manufacturers. At Gaziantep Textile and Apparel Machinery Fair GTM2025, which will bring the textile industry together under one roof, technology manufacturer brands will showcase their newest applications and will have the opportunity to exhibit their innovative products. Companies wishing to take advantage around domestic and foreign markets will have the opportunity to establish new business connections and to form new partnerships. The fair, which will increase the innovative capacity of the textile industry, will bring a mobility to the industry valued at millions of dollars.

At Textile and Apparel Machinery Fair, hundreds of companies will meet with their customers at the center of textile production and have the opportunity to exhibit their new machinery and technologies under the guidance of B2B meetings.

In addition to the textile production of Gaziantep, it is at the heart of Turkish textile production with the textile industry clustered around the neighboring cities. GTM 2025 exhibitors will have the opportunity to present their newest technologies to many industry professionals from Gaziantep and surrounding provinces such as Adana, Adiyaman, Kahramanmaraş, Kayseri, Malatya, Osmaniye and Şanlıurfa. The GTM 2025 Textile Machinery Fair, which brings together the leading figures in the textile industry with the region where 75 percent of Turkish textile production is carried out, will be the prevalent textile event both in Turkey and around the world. Textile and Apparel Machinery Market Size
According to the International Textile Manufacturers Federation ITMF data in 2023, the World Textile Machinery market has a volume of 32 billion 500 million dollars. Turkey is the largest buyer in this market after China and India.

According to TÜİK data;
In 2023, Turkish textile manufacturers imported machinery worth of 1 Billion 950 Million Dollars from foreign textile machinery manufacturers. Also, Turkish textile manufacturers purchased 1 Billion 450 Million dollars of machinery and technology from domestic machinery manufacturers for the local market. Turkish Textile machinery manufacturers achieved exports of 840 Million Dollars according to 2023 TÜİK data. Textile and ready-made clothing manufacturers exported nearly 41 billion dollars, according to 2023 Ministry of Industry and Technology data. The textile sector, which has such a large production potential, is an indispensable market for domestic and foreign textile and apparel machinery manufacturers due to reasons such as current developments and new technologies, as well as continuous modernization or capacity increase.



Turkey's Textile Production is Clustered Around 3 Major Areas
The first is the Marmara cluster, which includes Istanbul, Edirne, Sakarya, Düzce, Tekirdağ and Bursa. The second is the Aegean Cluster, which includes İzmir, Uşak, Aydın and Denizli. The share of the two regions listed above controls %25 of the Turkey's textile production. The region that achieves 75% of Turkey's main textile production is; Gaziantep, Adana, Kahramanmaraş, Malatya and Kayseri are the clustering regions. As a natural outcome of this clustering, the Turkish market, in wider acknowledgment, regarded as the prominent region to run the fair, for both domestic and foreign textile machinery manufacturers. Being aware of the importance of the region, many companies have established service centers in Gaziantep and surrounding provinces. (Japan-based Murata, Germany-based Trützschler, Italy-based Savio, Switzerland-based Rieter, Belgium-based Van De Wiele...)
In light of all these data, Gaziantep is in a unique position for the Textile Machinery Fair GTM2025.

ADANA (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 2 HOURS / 250 KM)

Adana, the seventh largest province of Turkey, positioned as the economic and urban center of the Çukurova region. Adana textile industry, which produces with the cumulative experience gained in years in the textile industry, realizes an export of up to 300 million dollars annually. According to Adana Chamber of Industry (ADASO) records, 282 textile enterprises are situated in the city. Companies operating in the textile sector mainly consist of yarn, woven and knitted fabrics as well as dyehouses. 12 of these companies are amongst Turkey's Top 500 Industrial Enterprises

ADIYAMAN (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 1 HOUR 30 MINUTES / 170 KM)

Adiyaman industry has progressed tremendously in the last decade due to advancements in the textile sector. The textile sector, which constitutes 36 percent of total industrial enterprises, is also the sector that creates the most employment. The yarn industry branch, which emerged based on processing cotton raw material, ranks third after cotton and ginning, covering 18 percent of the total textile enterprises.

KAHRAMANMARAŞ (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 45 MINUTES / 80 KM)

In the textile sector, which is the largest industry in the city, 400 thousand tons of yarn, 150 million meters of woven fabric, 50 million meters of denim, 140 thousand tons of knitted fabric and 30 million pieces of garment are produced annually. In addition, 205 thousand tons of dyeing and bleaching work is carried out. The establishment of the new organized industrial zone has been completed and the investments are in the process of moving to production phase. 6 of the companies operating in Kahramanmaraş are amongst Turkey's Top 500 Industrial Enterprises.

KAYSERİ (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 4 HOURS / 350 KM)

Textile and apparel products rank first in the total export figures of Kayseri, which is 4 hours away from Gaziantep by highway. Production is carried out mainly in the fields of yarn, denim, ready-made clothing, weaving and knitting in facilities equipped with modern machinery and production devices. 17 of the companies operating in Kayseri are amongst Turkey's Top 500 Industrial Enterprises.

GAZİANTEP

Gaziantep is the leader in many item categories with its Textile Production Capacities. In addition to the textile production carried out by Gaziantep, it is the center of Turkish textile production with the textile industry clustered around the neighboring cities..

Gaziantep is the leading producer in Turkey while achieving alone 91% of the machine-made carpet production in Turkey, 91% of the Polypropilen İplik / Polypropylene Yarn production produced in Turkey, 82% of Dokusuz kumaş /Nonwoven fabric production, 77% of (Akrilik İplik) Acrylic Yarn production, 48% of Gipe İplikler /Gipe Yarns production, 40% of the production of Çuval, torba / Bags and Sacks from PE/PP Band from PE or PP strip, 36% of the Pamuk İpliği / Cotton Yarn.

In the first 3 months of 2024, Gaziantep textile industry exported 340 million USD and became the province with the highest textile export after Istanbul. 71% portion of Turkish Textile Exports in the first three months were carried out from Istanbul and Gaziantep. 28 of the companies operating in Gaziantep are amongst Turkey's Top 500 Industrial Enterprises.

MALATYA (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 2 HOURS / 240 KM)

The textile industry continues to grow and expand gradually in Malatya. Malatya has the capacity to handle different fibers, produce different types of yarn and weave different types of network such as combed cotton, tarpaulin, awning, upholstery and indigo (denim). 54 percent of registered employment in Malatya is from the textile sector. Malatya, owns large enterprises in the field of textiles, ranked amongst the priority regions within the scope of the regional incentive system. Operating in Malatya, Baykan Denim A.Ş. is amongst Turkey's Top 500 Industrial Enterprises.

NİĞDE (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 4 HOURS / 400 KM)

There are many companies of various scales operating in the fields of yarn and knitting in the textile sector, which has the biggest stake in the development of the industry of Niğde. The province, which has two organized industrial zones, is at the center of attention of investors with its proximity to Mersin Port, highway connection avenues and with the incentives provided.

OSMANİYE (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 1 HOUR 30 MINUTES / 135 KM)

The textile sector is the most important area of activity in Osmaniye. In the city, investments of companies related to yarn production have increased with the developments in the textile sector in recent years. The overarching reason behind these investments reflected in the decision of the public to name Osmaniye along with Kahramanmaraş and Adiyaman amongst the priority provinces for investment in the implementation of investment incentives. 7 of these companies operating in Osmaniye are amongst Turkey's Top 500 Industrial Enterprises.

ŞANLIURFA (DISTANCE TO GAZİANTEP FAIRGROUND 1 HOUR / 125 KM)

Şanlıurfa's economic landscape is mainly based on the agricultural sector. With the transition to irrigated farming with the Southeastern Anatolia Project, companies operating in the field of cotton industry in Şanlıurfa are gaining importance, which positioned as the major destination in Turkey especially in the production of cotton, which is an industrial plant. There is an explosion in investment demand as Şanlıurfa which is amongst the 6th Regional provinces that access the incentives the most in the New Incentive System.

Why Gaziantep?

Textile machinery manufacturer companies participating in the fair will have the opportunity to directly reach the market with the hosting of Gaziantep, which holds a prominent importance in textiles, ready-made clothing, home textiles, carpet, nonwoven, fabric and yarn production. Gaziantep, which is amongst the provinces that have made significant progress in the textile sector, has been the leader in many product groups with its Textile Production Capacities. In addition to the textile production carried out by Gaziantep, the city positioned as the center of Turkish textile production with the textile industry which is clustered around the neighboring cities.

OFM Fair Center

Gaziantep OFM with its two fairgrounds covering an area of 14,250 m2 and a total closed area of 29,000 m2, has built-in offices for managers and restaurants, cooling and heating systems, press center, VIP and meeting hall. It has a capacity to accommodate a total of 10,000 vehicles with 2 separate parking areas. Additionally, a generator with a power of 520kW is in operation at the fair center. Gaziantep OFM has the infrastructure to support all kinds of technological tools and systems and fully meet the requirements such as energy, heating-cooling, air conditioning, telecom

munication, water, air, compressed air and the internet. With the availability of convenient access to the fairground, which has alternative transportation routes, the distance to the city center is 20km, to the central bus station is 6km for our visitors whom wish to travel by highway, and to the airport is 25km for our visitors, exhibitors and guests whom are visiting from other countries and other provinces of Turkey by airline. It is just 1 km away from Gaziantep-Adana highway. We have shuttles from the City Center and Airport during the fair.

91% of the machine-made carpet production produced in Turkey,

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77% of the Acrylic Yarn production produced in Turkey,

48% of the Gipe Yarns production produced in Turkey,

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36% of the production of the Cotton Yarn produced in Turkey.
